4.	Operations Updates from CoC Lead Agency	 Honeycutt reported: HUD Updates Honeycutt distributed 2020 CoC Membership forms. Forms must be completed annually. Honeycutt and Jazmyn Thomas are currently reviewing the HUD Rating and Ranking Tool. Honeycutt reported that the Veteran By-Name List workgroup has been working on a policy and procedure document for homeless veterans that will be distributed to the CoC when completed. Janet Smith from the Detroit VAMC leads this workgroup and has been building relationships with the shelters in Macomb. Referrals of veterans entering the Macomb Coordinated Entry system have increased as a result. 	

	MSHDA No update. Macomb Homeless Coalition Lead Agency Update Honeycutt stated that the Macomb Homeless Coalition has joined the Macomb County Anti-Trafficking Taskforce (MCAT) and Honeycutt will be on the Service Committee.	
5. HMIS Lead Agency Updates	 Garcia reported: All data entered into HMIS needs to be up to date due to the pending PIT Count. Data correction emails are being sent to HMIS users. MCAH is completing a data quality audit. Copies of the MSHDA pay for performance measures report were provided by Garcia. The reports reflect where our CoC measures currently; the threshold by which CoCs will be measured is not known at this time. The Board reviewed each measure with Garcia. Garcia will continue to run these reports quarterly for review. Agencies who receive MSHDA ESG funds were contacted for data cleanup. 	
6. CoC President Update	 Calnen reported: Board Elections Calnen thanked Mark Henderson and Deanne Honeycutt for their work on CoC Board elections. Elections take place at the CoC membership meeting on Wednesday, January 8. The CoC Board will vote on officer positions at the Board meeting in February. Advocacy Update A news article indicated there will be a new HUD proposal released that will propose a new rule to reduce the impact/requirement of Fair Housing. According to this news article, the new HUD rule would redefine what it means to promote fair housing, eliminate the assessment used to address barriers to racial integration, and encourage cities to remove regulations that stand in the way of affordable housing. Additionally, the rule also indicates HUD wants to rank communities based on housing costs and fair market rents, and give top performers priority for federal housing grants. 	Calnen will send out the proposed rule to Board members once it is released.

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	 A rule is scheduled to be released soon and will have a 60 day comment period. MCAH will likely have a public comment period at a state level and the Macomb CoC can coordinate with this effort. Calnen will work with the Awareness and Advocacy committee. Governance Charter The Board reviewed the changes made to the CoC Governance Charter. Motion made by Curley to approve the changes made to the Governance Charter and to bring the revised Charter to the CoC Membership for a vote to approve the charter, seconded by Lasher. 	Motion approved.
7. Standing Committee Updates	 a.) Point in Time Committee Honeycutt reported that there is a training for PIT Count on Tuesday, January 14. MHC is seeking donations of \$5 gift cards or funds to purchase gift cards to distribute during the PIT Count. b.) Coordinated Entry Systems Committee Honeycutt reported that the next meeting is Thursday, January 23 at the MCFRC at 9 a.m. The committee is currently evaluating the coordinated entry system. c.) Grant Ranking Committee Honeycutt reported that the committee is currently reviewing the HUD tool. d.) Compliance Committee Curley reported on behalf of Revyn that the committee needs to meet and review the compliance process moving forward. e.) HMIS and Data Quality Committee Garcia reported that MCAH data quality audit has been ongoing. f.) Awareness and Advocacy Committee
