	 Henderson shared a success story relating to a client that will be moving to PH for the first time since 2009. This is a direct result of the Coordinated Assessment. Merchant reminded members that Coordinated Assessment is one of the system performance measure used to evaluate a CoC. 95% of referrals to agencies are coming from coordinated assessment.
