4. Macomb Community Action – 2020 ESG Funding Feedback	Jazmyn Thomas from Macomb Community Action presented: HUD ESG funding is received each year by Macomb Community Action as a direct entitlement. MCA is required to come to the CoC for consultation on how funds should be spent. Thomas stated that Macomb Community Action is seeking a letter with feedback by November on the use of ESG funding for 2020. Feedback can be provided to Honeycutt via email. In 2019, there was a total of \$158,000 from HUD for ESG. The funds were allocated as follows: Admin: \$11,856 HMIS: \$5,085 Rapid Rehousing: \$45,141			

	 Shelter Operations: \$50,998 Seeking feedback on the needs in the community. Keep in mind barriers with HUD ESG, including a dollar for dollar, 100% match. Calnen asked what is eligible for match. Thomas stated case management and wages paid to shelter staff depending on the source, but MSHDA ESG cannot be used to match HUD ESG. Other funds such as fundraising funds and some in-kind resources can be used as match. Questions about ESG funds or match can be directed to Jazmyn Thomas at 586-783-0916.
5. Coordinator's Report	HUD Updates Honeycutt reported that the Macomb CoC was not selected for funding for the Youth Homelessness Demonstration Project. No agencies in Michigan were selected for the YHDP. However, the CoC will continue to strengthen our youth providers and relationships with the Youth Action Board. HUD Consolidation Application Presentation was completed at the end of the meeting due to technology issues. Honeycutt reviewed, section by section, the draft HUD NOFA Consolidated Application currently located in HUD e-snaps. MSHDA Merchant reported that the ESG Application first part and Exhibit 1 are completed. Funds received total \$463,783 and are broken down as follows: Street outreach: \$32,727 Shelter operations: \$104,562 Homelessness prevention: \$111,805 Rapid Rehousing: \$133,528 HMIS: \$46,378 All portions have been submitted in a timely fashion. Partners are: Family Youth Interventions, MCREST, Salvation Army MATTS, and Macomb Homeless Coalition. Macomb Homeless Coalition Lead Agency Update No update.
6. President's Report	 Calnen reported: State ID fee waiver – advocacy is needed. A bill in House HB 4853 went to committee and would waive all fees for any vital documents if you are a person who is homeless. Either a letter from service agency or an HMIS ID to verify. Thank you to all who assisted with the HUD NOFA.

7. Committee Updates

Coordinated Entry Systems Committee

- Honeycutt reported: meetings are bi-monthly now.
- Calnen stated that CE Committee meetings are open to all agencies, not just those who are funded through CoC.
- Garcia stated that any participants on the call should receive the full privacy training since client information is being discussed.
